Dr. Moira Inghilleri is Professor and Program Director of Comparative Literature and Director of Translation and Interpreting Studies at the University of Massachusetts Amherst. She is the author of *Translation and Migration* (2017) and *Interpreting Justice: Ethics, Politics and Language* (2012). She was co-editor for the Routledge series *New Perspectives in Translation and Interpreting Studies* from 2013-2018 and guest-edited two issues of *The Translator: "Bordieu and the Sociology of Translating and Interpreting"* (2005) and "Translation and Violent Conflict" (2010, with Sue-Ann Harding).

Dr. Inghilleri's lecture, "Ethics in Translation and Interpreting Practice and Research" will take up concepts like impartiality and neutrality found in many codes of ethics and consider how they are 'practiced' by translators and interpreters across a range of texts (spoken and written) and contexts. The lecture will conclude with a focus on the topic of migration and the challenges of translating trauma.
