Research Scholarship Overview

Deadline: Friday, May 31, 2019*

The Research Scholarship is offered to exceptional foreign students who wish to conduct research at Japanese universities (MA and/or PhD degrees may be awarded depending on chosen course of study.)

Qualifications summary: Applicants must...

- Be a US citizen (to apply in the US).
- Be born on or after April 2, 1985.
- Be a university or college graduate with a 4 year degree or greater.
- Intend to research a field related to what the applicant studied in at their previous university.
- Have high scholastic achievement.

Award: University tuition and fees are waived. Grantee receives a monthly living stipend.	Duration: Research: April 2020-March 2022 OR October 2020-March 2022 Maximum 2 years (includes 6 months of Japanese language training). Degree-seeking terms may vary depending on course of study.
Transportation: Airfare Provided	Master's/PhD: Necessary period for the completion of the regular program of the respective courses
Japanese Language Requirement: Depends on chosen course of study. Must be willing to learn and study in Japanese.	

*This is NOT a postmarked deadline. Only applications that physically arrive at the Consulate General of Japan in Miami by this date will be considered.
